

## Your Church Donations at Work

West Lake Christian Church financially supports many charitable organizations through out our community with monthly donations. Below is a brief description of one of them;

**Medical Missions for Christ** is located at 1974 North Business Route 5 in Camdenton.



Our mission is to provide medical, dental and other health services to qualified individuals of the lake area, to share the love of Christ, and to improve the health of both the

individual and our community.

We serve the counties of Camden, Miller and Morgan. We receive no government funding and do not charge patients for our services. All funding is provided by grants, donations from individuals, churches and civic groups.

We serve persons 18 years to Medicare age with doctors, dentists, chiropractors and the prescription assistance program. They can have no insurance of any kind and prove residency and all income. Call

for the full list of documents to bring on your first visit. We do registration only on Mondays from 11 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

All of our help; doctors, nurses, dentists and clerical are volunteer except for two part-time paid persons. The mammogram van comes every 3 months from Ellis Fischel.

There are many ways to help with volunteering a position or donating office supplies or cash. Right now, we are very fortunate to have the help of nine doctors and nurse practitioner BUT we need nurses. If you are a retired nurse, you could work as little as four hours a month or much more.

For more information on Medical Missions for Christ, brochures are on the table in entryway.



## Applying Bible Principles

A few years ago, the world was thrown into confusion and chaos. The Middle East had oil, and the rest of the world wanted that oil. This was a crisis situation. The perception was that we were running out of oil. In reality, that wasn't the situation at all. We were not running out of oil. As Larry O'Nan described it, "The core problem was a matter of imbalance, greed, and selfishness. Competition had created an environment where we thought we needed to get something before someone else got it."

Just as perception created an illusion that the world was running out of oil, perception has created an illusion when it comes to giving to the work of the Lord and to His ministry at West Lake Christian Church. The perception is that our financial resources are insufficient to enable us to give. Some of us think that we simply cannot afford to give.

But that's not the situation at all. Even poverty (something which is probably not descriptive of anyone in our midst) is not a reason for not giving to the Lord. The Christians in Macedonia were very poor. As 2 Corinthians 8:2 describes them, they were in "extreme poverty." Yet, even in that situation, they were full of joy and gave as much as they were able — and more. How could they do that?

The reason they gave abundantly, eagerly and willingly out of their "extreme poverty" was that they "gave themselves first to the Lord." That's the secret of giving that honors God. When we give ourselves to Him wholeheartedly and without reservation of any kind, then our financial resources will follow.

During the reign of Oliver Cromwell, the government ran out of silver with which to make coins. Cromwell sent his men everywhere to see if they could find more of the precious metal. They returned to report that the only silver they could find was in the statues of the saints which were on display in various cathedrals. "Good," replied Cromwell. "We will melt down the saints and put them into circulation."

As you consider the offering which will be received next Sunday at West Lake Christian Church, and as you consider the resources God has placed at your disposal, will you be "melted down" for His service and His glory? Like the Macedonian Christians, will you — regardless of your financial situation — first give yourself to the Lord and then allow your financial resources to follow?

### Seniors: Be smart about medicines

It's true that medicines confer many benefits. But as people age, their bodies may process medicines less efficiently. This can make the medicine less effective. And when people take lots of different medicines, they're at higher risk for dangerous drug interactions. To avoid mistakes with medicines, heed this advice from the [National Institutes of Health](#), the [American Geriatrics Society](#), the [U.S. Food and Drug Administration](#) and other groups:

**Partner with your doctor** Share information. Health professionals can make a better decision about what to prescribe if you tell them about past problems you have had with medicines, such as rashes, indigestion or dizziness.

Be honest about your habits. A medicine's effectiveness can be affected by how much coffee, tea or alcohol you drink and whether or not you smoke.

**Ask questions.** Don't leave your doctor's office without asking why you need a prescribed medicine and how you should take it.

Write the answers down or ask the doctor to provide you with written directions. Talk to your doctor if you have trouble swallowing tablets. The same medicine may come in liquid form.

Never break, crush or chew tablets unless the doctor says it's OK.

**Do your homework:** Make two lists. On each list, include all prescription and nonprescription medicines, herbal supplements, vitamins and laxatives you take—even those from specialists such as dentists and eye doctors. Keep one list at home and carry the other one in your wallet or purse for a quick reference if you need it.

**Take medicine on schedule.** It may be easiest to remember your medicine schedule if it coincides with a routine. For example, if you need medicine at 8 a.m. and 10 p.m., take the first dose when you brush your teeth each morning and the evening dose when you're ready for bed.

You could also use:

A pill box or an egg carton to sort pills.

A handheld computer.

A lamp with a timer programmed to go on when it's time for your medicine.

A chart listing the name of the medicine, what it's for, who prescribed it, how and when to take it, how much to take, its color and shape, and possible side effects. **Follow doctor's orders** Take medicine as prescribed. Even if you feel better, don't stop taking your medicine. The problem may return if you stop too soon. If the medicine doesn't seem to help, call your doctor before you quit taking it. Know what to do if you miss a dose. It may not be safe to decide for yourself. Check the information sheet that comes with your medicine, or contact a doctor or pharmacist for advice.

**Be aware of side effects.** If you have symptoms that you suspect are due to a medicine, record how the symptoms make you feel and when they occur, then share this information with your doctor. If symptoms are severe, call right away. Your medicine may need to be changed or adjusted.

**Let your pharmacist help.** Buy all medicines at one pharmacy, if possible. This allows the pharmacist to check your complete record and advise you of potential drug interactions.

Request easy-to-open medicine containers if you have trouble with childproof caps. Keep all medicines out of reach when young children are in your home.

**Be careful with nonprescription medicines.** Some over-the-counter drugs have the same active ingredients. Taking these nonprescription medicines together might cause a bad reaction. Read the labels and/or ask the pharmacist to make sure the drug is safe for you.

**Get help with medicine costs.** If you need help to cover the cost of your prescriptions, don't skip doses or take half doses of medicine to save money. Your doctor or pharmacist may know about organizations that provide financial assistance. Also, ask about switching to generic medicines that cost less. You might also be able to save money by enrolling in the Medicare Part D prescription drug benefit program. Learn more at [www.medicare.gov](http://www.medicare.gov).
