Ideally Speaking By Jim Sutherlin

"A Covenant of Closure"

At the November meeting of the General Board, I presented for their approval the following "Covenant of Closure" between myself and our congregation. I knew you would want to see it and I will be glad to discuss it with you at any time.

"With gratitude for all the love and kindness which has been shown to me as your Pastor; with heartfelt prayers for your future years of service to Christ; and with a renewed commitment to serve your best interests even in my absence; I make these promises:

- That I will separate myself from participation in the life and congregation of West Lake Christian Church for a period of one year.
- I will be a true and loyal friend to individual members and the congregation as a whole, but I will not make pastoral calls, hospital calls, or counsel with members, or preside at weddings or funerals of members, and I will decline all offices, positions and responsibilities in this, my former congregation.
- I will welcome opportunities to be with members socially and will be glad to discuss with them anything except West Lake Christian Church matters.
- I will speak only with the Regional/Area Minister or the current pastor of West Lake Christian Church about any problems I perceive in the congregation, and not discuss them with members of the congregation or others in the community.
- I will communicate with the Regional/Area Minister should confusion, conflict or other differences arise between myself and West Lake Christian Church or its members.

If at the end of one year I wish to participate in the life of West Lake Christian Church, I will communicate such interest to the Regional/Area Minister who will facilitate discussion of this possibility with the congregation and its pastor. If such participation is deemed appropriate, a "Covenant for a New Ministry When the Previous Minister is Remaining in the Community" will be established.

I reaffirm my ordination vows as an Ordained Minister of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and my continued commitment to the "Ministerial Code of Ethics" which I adopted at the time or my ordination."



Notes from the Moderator

With very few exceptions, December is a month of endings. One exception of course is the birth of the baby Jesus. For our church it is the end of the ministry of Jim and Judy Sutherlin. They have strengthened my faith and given me new insight into the meaning and purpose of coming to the Lord's Table each and every time we meet for worship. For this I give them thanks and wish them well in the years ahead.

Every ending signals a new beginning. We will be welcoming an Interim Minister and begin a search for a new minister. The General Board has voted to form a Transition Team composed of church members who will guide the exit of our present minister, advise the Interim during the between period and counsel the new minister as he or she adjusts and settles in. All members and associate members of the congregation will be asked to submit the names of three fellow members that they think would be the very best persons to guide us in the days ahead. These names will be collated and the 3 to 7 most often named will be asked to serve.

Pray for the unity of our congregation. Pray for the work of the Search Committee. Pray that the Transition Team helps smooth the road in the days ahead.



Flu Vaccine

There are two types of vaccines: The "flu shot" is an inactivated vaccine (killed virus) that is given with a needle, usually in the arm. The flu shot is approved for individuals older than 6 months, for both the healthy and people with chronic health conditions. Nasal-spray flu vaccine is made with live, but weakened flu viruses that do not cause the flu. It is approved for use in healthy individuals 2-49 years old, but should not be used for women who are pregnant. Each vaccine contains three influenza viruses. The viruses in the vaccine change each year based on international prediction regarding the strains of viruses that will circulate in a given year. Both the flu shot and the nasal-spray vaccine are effective at preventing the flu.

The best time to be vaccinated for the flu is during the months of October and November. The vaccine may be given up to the first of January. Yearly vaccinations are recommended for most people. Talk with your physician should you have any question about this vaccination. About two weeks after receiving the vaccination, antibodies that provide protection against the influenza virus infection develop in the body.

Those who should not be vaccinated without first consulting their physician are individuals who are allergic to chicken eggs, individuals who have had a severe reaction to any influenza vaccination, those who have developed Guillain-Barre syndrome (GBS), children under six months old, and those who have a moderate to severe illness should wait to get vaccinated until the symptoms are resolved.

The effectiveness of the flu vaccine to protect a person depends on the age and health status of the person receiving the vaccine, and the similarity or 'match' between the virus strains in the vaccine and those in the environment.

Different side effects can be associated with the flu shot and nasal spray vaccine. Soreness, redness, or swelling where the shot was given, low grade fever and some body aches are the most common symptoms that occur. If illness does occur, they begin soon after the shot and usually last one to two days. However, on rare occasions, flu vaccination can cause serious problems, such as severe allergic reactions. The viruses in the nasal-spray vaccine are live weakened viruses and do not cause severe symptoms that are often associated with the influenza illness. Symptoms include; runny nose, wheezing, headache, vomiting, muscle aches, fever, sore throat and cough. Seek your physicians counsel for any concerns.
