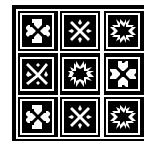

On the package of Extra Sugar Free gum is the following message: "In case of boredom, break wrapper." For some reason my mind's immediate response was to recover a vision of our Alpaca sitting in the barn chewing its cud. It is hard to see that or chewing gum as an answer to boredom.

One of the things we can observe in ourselves and others is that boredom reflects upon the nature and character of the person. Being alive, vital and engaged with existence is anything but boring.

Jesus once said, "I have come to bring life and to bring it abundantly." Jesus told stories and taught on a fairly constant basis. A biography is one of the means through which we enrich our lives. Biographies speak of great people who have given their lives to action, spirituality, and learning. May His presence be very real to you today.

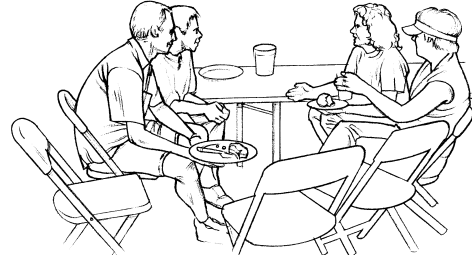

Lamb House has completed its fiscal year. Our information is as follows:

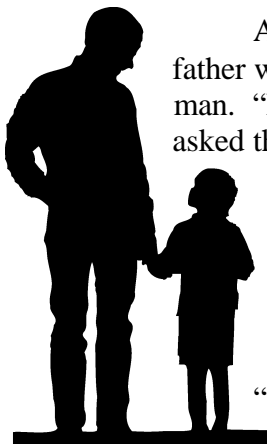
Individuals served	10,670

Wellness Tip of the Month

Animal Bites

Animal bites are more commonly caused by domestic animals, but can occur with wild animals. Dogs are more likely to bite, but a cat bite causes more infections. Wild animals and non-immunized domestic animals are more likely to carry rabies.

Symptoms

1. A break or cut in the skin with or without bleeding, which may be a puncture type wound.
2. Bruising and/or swelling in the area of the bite.
3. Bites from a bat may be so insignificant, that a person may not be aware they have been bitten.
4. Other diseases may also be transmitted by an animal bite, causing headaches and fever.

First Aid

1. Stay calm and keep the person calm.
2. Wash your hands before and after caring for the bite. Wear gloves if available.
3. If the wound is bleeding, apply direct pressure with a clean, dry cloth and raise the area until the bleeding stops.
4. If the area is not bleeding, wash it with mild soap and running water for 3-5 minutes. Then cover the bite with antibiotic ointment and a clean dressing.
5. All animal bites need to be reported to the nearest animal control center.

Contact a Medical Professional if:

1. The animal bite is from an unknown or wild animal.
2. The person has not had a tetanus shot in the last 5 years.
3. There is swelling, redness, pain or drainage from the wound.
4. The bite is on the face, neck, or hands.
5. The bite is deep or large, there are multiple bites, or the person has need of stitches.

Prevention

1. Do not pet animals without consent of the owner.
2. Do not provoke or tease animals.
3. Do not approach strange animals, no matter how cute.
4. Wild animals may protect themselves by biting or scratching.
5. Do not go near or try to catch the animal after it has bitten someone.
6. Call the animal control center.
7. Teach these things to your children.

These items will be shared with people in the community who need them. Bring your donated items to the Civic Center behind Osage River Restaurant on Friday September 25 from 4 p.m. until 8 p.m. The doors will open at 8 a.m. on Saturday, September 26, and the community is invited to take whatever they need—it is all free.

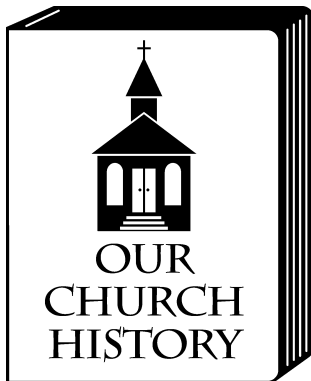
