Applying Bible Principles

When Samuel was seeking someone to succeed Saul as King of Israel, he examined the sons of Jesse. In that process, he considered their stature and physical characteristics in great detail, only to be told by God, "Man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart."

That *modus operandi* on God's part has not changed over the centuries of time. He still looks at the hearts of men and women. He is not as interested in how things appear on the outside, but what they are really like on the inside. And God's scrutiny extends to every area of our lives, including our giving.

Specifically, He wants to know not just what or when we are giving, but **why**. He is not so concerned about the amount or the percentage but with the reason or motive why we give. It's not that amounts or percentages are not important, for they certainly are. But what is of greater importance is **why** we give.

If we only give out of a sense of duty, to impress someone, to keep a commitment we made, or to "do our part," we've missed the point. If we only give a certain amount or percentage because we've always given that way, we've missed the point. If we parcel out money to help "poor ol' God pay His bills," we've missed the point.

God owns it all! He doesn't need our money to pay His bills. He doesn't want us to give out of a sense of obligation or duty or habit. Nor does He want us to give to impress someone else. He wants us to give out of hearts motivated by love for Him in response to His love for us. He wants us to give as part of our worship and praise to Him. He wants us to give because giving is part of His way of growing Christians.

There's an old Indian fable about a mouse who, like all mice, was afraid of cats. A medicine man felt sorry for him and offered to help him lose his fear. With the mouse's approval, the medicine man turned him into a cat. The cat, however, was afraid of dogs, so the medicine man turned the cat into a dog. But the dog was afraid of tigers, so the medicine man turned the dog into a tiger. When the medicine man discovered the tiger was afraid of hunters, he exclaimed in disgust, "You're hopeless. What you need is a change of heart. And that I cannot give you."

If our giving is motivated by anything other than a heart of love for God, we need a change of heart. We need to realize afresh that God owns everything and that we are just managers and stewards. We need to realize that when we give, we are only giving back to God what was rightfully His in the first place. And we need to understand that when we give out of love for God and not out of habit or duty or obligation, we are giving in a way that truly honors and glorifies Him.

SAMARITAN'S PURSE – OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD 2017
Collection Deadline November 12
West Lake Christian Church GOAL: 110 BOXES plus \$990

Operation Christmas Child is a way to help in evangelism and discipleship of children across the globe. In 2016 11.5 million boxes reached children in 100+ countries and 1.6 million boys & girls made decisions for Christ!

Each gift box is delivered with a book about Jesus in the child's language. Teachers provide a 12-lesson class "The Greatest Journey" where children learn to follow Christ and share Him with others. At the end of their classes each child receives a Bible in his/her own language.

WHAT: Shoebox sized gift boxes are filled and sent to children in 3rd world countries
Boxes are delivered throughout the year so no Santa or Christmas symbols used.

HOW TO HELP:

- 1) Pray for this project and the children who will be reached
- 2) Take a box (or use your own shoe box sized box (cardboard or plastic); fill it as a family, affix the label showing boy/girl and age group.

Boxes options: Girl or Boy; in ages 2-4; 5-9 or 10-14.

We are encouraged to include a picture and bit about ourselves so child has a sense of who sent the box.

You may track the box by donating \$9 on line www.samaritanaspurse.org and printing and affixing the label you receive at that time.

AND/OR

- 3) Buy and bring to church new or "like new" items for the boxes – place in bins.
- 4) Donate \$\$\$ to the project. Goal \$990.
(Check to West Lake Christian (or cash) designated for Operation Christmas Child.)
We need \$9 per box to cover costs of the book on Christ they put with each box, material for the 12 week class and the shipping/delivery of boxes..
- 5) Help pack boxes Tuesday Nov. 14 10-5 at church

DATES: Sunday November 12 - deadline for bringing items for the boxes. .
Tuesday November 14 from 10-5 - **PACKING SESSION** at Church
Boxes will be taken to Linn Creek to Rock House Church later that week.

Snowbird Winter Checklist:

1. Set heat to 50 degrees
2. Turn water off
3. Turn ice maker off
4. Turn off water heater
5. Open water faucet to relieve pressure
6. Unplug water softener
7. Unplug TV/ Cable box and computer
8. Think about installing a timer on your lights so it looks like someone is home
9. Leave a key with someone you trust so they can check on things while you are away.
Ask them to pick up any newspapers or flyers that might be lying around and an indicator no one is home.
10. Leave contact information in case of an emergency
11. Give you kitchen a last minute once over. Have you emptied the fridge of anything that spoils? Did you take out the garbage? Is your dishwasher empty? How about your washing machine? The last thing you want to come home to is a smelly house.
12. If you'll be away for more than 30 days you may have the Post Office forward your mail to sunnier climates. It's free to do this for up to 6 months with an optional 6 month extension.

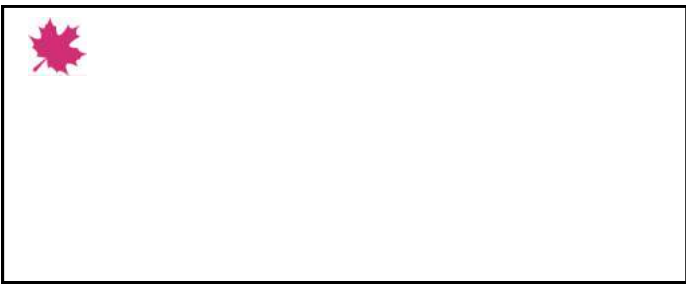
