Applying Bible Principles October

In the years prior to his assumption of power in Germany, Adolph Hitler was a master of deception. He made free use of the Christian vocabulary and talked about the blessing of Almighty God and the Christian confessions of faith which would become the pillars of his new state. He assumed the earnestness of a man who is utterly weighed down by historic responsibility. He handed out pious stories to the press, especially to the church papers. He showed his tattered Bible to many church leaders and declared that he drew the strength for his great work from the Word of God. According to one pastor, "He was actually able to introduce a pietistic timbre into his voice which caused many religious people to welcome him as a man sent from God."

As the world learned to its horror in later years, Hitler was an impostor. He had only used these things to mask his real intentions and to fool people. He was what could be accurately labeled the "master hypocrite." He said one thing while actually doing exactly the opposite.

When it comes to hypocrisy, Adolph Hitler was in a league by himself. None of us desires to be — or should ever be — compared to him or his despicable actions. However, when it comes to the Christian life, sometimes we, too, say one thing and do another. We pretend to be great students of the Bible, when we actually seldom look at the Book. We give the impression that we spend hours in prayer, when we very seldom engage in prayer except when at church. We pretend to love other Christians, when, in reality, we can't stand some of them.

This kind of behavior is also possible when it comes to giving. We might like to convey the impression that we are "good givers," and we might be reasonably successful in our efforts since other people usually do not actually "see" our financial situation and our giving. However, if we are trying to say one thing and do another concerning our giving to the Lord, we will be confronted by our deception every time we look at the register in our checkbook. Here's why: Our checkbook will quickly and methodically strip away our pretense. We can deceive others; we can even deceive ourselves in many areas of life, but our checkbook always tells the truth about what is really important to us.

The Apostle Paul summed up this matter of saying one thing and then of doing what we say with this statement: the testimony of our conscience should be ". . . that we have conducted ourselves in the world . . . in the holiness and sincerity that are from God" (2 Cor. 1:12). In other words, by walking in holiness and sincerity that God provides in response to our obedience, what we do will match what we say, including in the area of giving.

Think about it: If your checkbook could talk, what would it say about you and about your giving to the work of the Lord at West Lake Christian Church? Would it testify that you are walking in "holiness and sincerity" in your giving, or would it have a different story to tell?

SAMARITAN'S PURSE – OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD 2017

Kick Off October 1 – Deadline November 12
West Lake Christian Church GOAL: 110 BOXES plus \$990

Operation Christmas Child is a way to help in evangelism and discipleship of children across the globe. In 2016 11.5 million boxes reached children in 100+ countries and 1.6 million boys & girls made decisions for Christ! and through the children- families!!.

Each gift box is delivered with a book about Jesus in the child's language. Teachers provide a 12-lesson class "The Greatest Journey" where children learn to follow Christ and share Him with others. At the end of their classes each child receives a Bible in his/her own language.

WHAT: Shoebox sized gift boxes are filled and sent to children in 3rd world countries
Boxes are delivered throughout the year so no Santa or Christmas symbols used.

HOW TO HELP:

- 1) Pray for this project and the children who will be reached
- 2) Take a box (or use your own shoe box sized box (cardboard or plastic); fill it as a family, affix the label showing boy/girl and age group.
Boxes options: Girl or Boy; in ages 2-4; 5-9 or 10-14.
We are encouraged to include a picture and bit about ourselves so child has a sense of who sent the box.
You may track the box by donating \$9 on line www.samaritanaspurse.org and printing and affixing the label you receive at that time. AND/OR
- 3) Buy and bring to church new or "like new" items for the boxes – place in bins.
(see idea list on back)
- 4) Donate \$\$\$ to the project. Goal \$990.
(Check to West Lake Christian (or cash) designated for Operation Christmas Child.)
We need \$9 per box to cover costs of the book on Christ they put with each box, material for the 12 week class and the shipping/delivery of boxes..
- 5) Help pack boxes Tuesday Nov. 14 10-5 at church

Samaritan's Purse is headed by Franklin Graham.

DATES: Sunday November 12 - deadline for bringing items for the boxes. .
Tuesday November 14 from 10-5 - PACKING SESSION at Church
Boxes will be taken to Linn Creek to Rock House Church later that week.

Wellness Tip of the Month September, 2017 Urinary Tract Infections

What Is It?

The urinary tract includes the bladder, kidneys, the tubes that go between them (ureters) and the tube that takes the urine outside of your body (urethra). If germs enter any part of this system it can be called a Urinary Tract Infection (UTI). Most infections are bladder infections. If the infection involves the kidneys, the symptoms can be much more severe, causing permanent damage.

Symptoms

- Pain or burning during urination
- Urine is cloudy or smells bad
- Frequent urination
- Urinating in small amounts
- Pain on one side of your back under your ribs-associated with the kidneys
- Fever and chills
- Nausea and vomiting

Diagnosis

If you have any of these symptoms, see your physician, especially if you have diabetes, kidney problems, a weak immune system, are over the age of 65 or are pregnant. The doctor will collect a urine sample and test for an infection. They may also do extra tests to see if they can find a cause for the infection.

Treatment


If the doctor prescribes antibiotics, make sure that you take the full dose, even if you start to feel better. You should also drink plenty of water, drink cranberry juice or take cranberry pills, empty your bladder completely when urinating, and urinate frequently.

If you start to feel worse, see your doctor or go to the ER.


